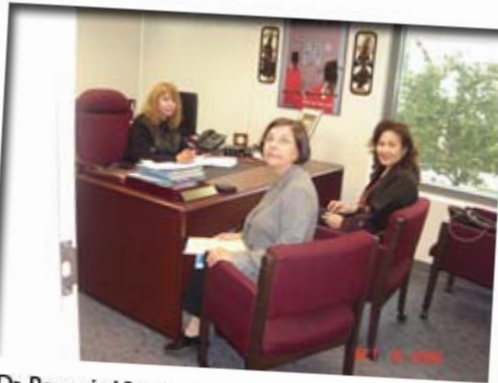
# CSUSB INTERNATIONAL ACTIVITIES: SOME SNAPSHOTS
